Requirements:



- Have a research placement under a UCF faculty member
- Attend L.E.A.R.N. Mentor Training on October 30th 9AM-12PM
- Mentor a L.E.A.R.N. student 3 hours per week during the scholarship period (Jan-April)
- Complete evaluation forms and reflections
