<b>Hours:</b>	10 hours per week; this is an in-person position
<b>Rate of Pay:</b>	\$11.50 per hour; this position is contingent upon funding

The ACE and Access programs facilitate academic success among UCF students by providing ongoing one-on-one and group coaching. The ACE Program is open to all students enrolled at UCF while the Access Program is a six-week summer B program where students are invited by Undergraduate Admissions. Coaches will assist students with building college-level academic strategies in both programs. They will also help students develop knowledge of campus resources and enhance their connection to the university by strengthening their support system on campus. During the summer B Access program, coaches will pair up to facilitate weekly group coaching with cohorts of 15 students. The programs also collaborate with various campus partners each semester to provide support for specific populations on campus.

### Responsibilities

- Assist students with building college-level academic strategies using the below topics:
  - Time management & organizational skills
  - Learning styles and study skills
  - Test prep & test-taking strategies
  - Textbook reading & note-taking
  - Memory & concentration
  - Goal setting & motivation
  - Stress management
  - Online learning
  - Campus resources
- Complete all administrative duties accurately on time

### Additional Responsibilities

- Participate in preliminary and on-going trainings and team meetings
- Assist students in evaluating study habits/knowledge of online courses and identifying obstacles to their learning process
- Serve as a role model for students by maintaining a positive attitude and cultivating relationships
- Document all coaching sessions & maintain accurate student files
- Submit student reports to supervisor(s) regarding progress of students
- Communicate training needs and/or student concerns to supervisor(s)
- Provide timely and open communication with SARC staff regarding students' progress, issues and concerns in an effort to increase effectiveness of ACE and Access Programs and professional staff
- Participate in midterm and final evaluations
- Other duties as assigned

### Required Qualifications

- Currently enrolled as a UCF student
- At least 24 credits earned at UCF if undergraduate; at least nine credits earned at UCF if graduate student
- Must be in good academic standing with the university; minimum GPA of a 3.0 or higher



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**Preferred Qualifications**

- Experience working with students in a mentoring (or similar) role
- Graduate student
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills; ease in relating to people from diverse backgrounds
- Solid time management and organizational skills; problem-solving skills; high attention to detail
