WHAT?

Most UCF majors require 120 credit hours. If you take 30 credit hours each year, you'll graduate in four years. Begin the fall semester of your second year with 30 or more completed credit hours and you're twice as likely to earn your bachelor's degree on time.

WHY?

Graduate in four years, and you'll save money, reduce debt, and begin your career or graduate school sooner.

HOW?

Create a plan to take 30 credit hours based on your schedule. There are multiple credit hour combinations that include taking classes during the summer.

NEED PROOF?

- Students who earned 30 or more credits before starting their second fall semester were almost twice as likely to graduate within four years.
- Thirty percent of undergraduates borrow money from the federal government and typically have \$36,510 in education-related debt.*
- In 2019, the median income for individuals aged 22 to 27 years with a bachelor's degree was \$44,000.**
