## Foreign Language Proficiency (Bachelor of Arts)

Students graduating with a Bachelor of Arts degree must demonstrate proficiency in a foreign language equivalent to one year of college instruction. This requirement may be met either by successful completion of the appropriate college-level course or by examination. Languages that may be used include those taught at UCF and any others for which the University can obtain standardized proficiency tests. Students who have previously received a baccalaureate degree are exempt from this requirement.

## Option 1 - Complete Two Courses

For students with limited to no language proficiency, you may complete two courses, Elementary Language I and Elementary Language II, in your language of choice offered by the Department of Modern Languages and Literatures or the Department of History (Hebrew). You will complete 8 credit hours of lower division course credit.

## Option 2 - Complete One Course

For students with moderate language proficiency, you may complete one course by skipping Elementary Language I and proceeding directly to Elementary Language II or a higher-level language course (Intermediate I through upper level course) in your language of choice offered by the Department of Modern Languages and Literatures or the Department of History (Hebrew). You will complete 3-4 credit hours of course credit.

Students who are native or heritage speakers, or who have otherwise developed some proficiency in a foreign language, should not start in the Elementary levels of a language. Please review the proficiency testing options below or contact the appropriate department, outlined on page 2, for placement at the appropriate level.

## Option 3 - Satisfy through Proficiency

## CLEP

For students proficient in another language and needing to demonstrate only one-year proficiency for their declared program, College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) testing is available in the University Testing Center. Depending on your score you will earn between $0-8$ credit hours of language course credit. Credit at the Elementary Language Level II (XXX 1121) is required to meet the oneyear proficiency.
Available in French, German, and Spanish.

## Hebrew Proficiency Exam

For students proficient in Hebrew and needing to demonstrate only one-year proficiency for their declared program, the Hebrew Proficiency Exam is available in the University Testing Center. With a passing score you will satisfy the one-year proficiency requirement. The exam does not award any course credit.

## English as Second Language

A student who is required and furnishes a passing TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) score for admission to the University is considered to have satisfied the requirements.

## FLATS

For students proficient in another language and needing to demonstrate only one-year proficiency for their declared program, Foreign Language Achievement Testing Service (FLATS) testing is available in the University Testing Center. With a passing score you will satisfy the one-year proficiency requirements. The FLATS does not award any course credit. Available in over 50 languages.

## MLL Proficiency Process

Additional foreign language proficiency evaluation is available through the Department of Modern Languages and Literatures (MLL) in the following situations:

1. For students with programs that require foreign language proficiency beyond the one-year proficiency requirement.
2. For students that are proficient in another language that testing is not available through the University Testing Center.

Availability of language proficiency evaluation is dependent on availability of faculty in MLL. MLL proficiency evaluation is not available during summer.
