



Online Degree Program Admission Policy Update

• We have EASED our application process for our online degree programs (Hospitality Management, Lifestyle Community Management and Lodging and Restaurant Management).

Freshman Students

- 1. Admission to UCF with 2.5 or better high school GPA
- 2. Resume with 100 or more volunteer hours of relevant hospitality industry experience; or 2 years of relevant hospitality industry work experience
- 3. Freshman admits will not be permitted to take more than 3 courses or 9 credit hours in their admit term
- 4. Deadlines FALL May 1, SPRING November 1, SUMMER March 1

Transfer Students

- 1. Admission to UCF with 2.5 or better cumulative GPA
- 2. Resume with 2 years of relevant hospitality industry work experience
- 3. Deadlines FALL July 1, SPRING November 1, SUMMER March 1

Online Degree Program Acceptance Policy and Overview for currently enrolled UCF students.

Current Students

- 1. 2.5 or better UCF GPA
- 2. Resume with 2 years of relevant hospitality industry work experience
- 3. Credit Hours (in consideration of Timely Academic Progress Toward a Degree policy)
- 4. Deadlines FALL July 1, SPRING November 1, SUMMER March 1

Deadlines

Rosen College Online Admissions decisions will be made on a rolling basis. Priority deadline for decisions will align with Undergraduate Admissions. Students who do not meet GPA criteria will be deferred until 1 month after priority deadline. Internally, deferred students will be ranked by GPA. The number of deferred students to be admitted is at the discretion of the Program Advisor, Program Manager, Director of Student Services, and or RCHM Dean of Academic Affairs. Deferred students with 2.3 or lower GPA will only be permitted to take 3 courses or 9 credit hours in their admit term.
